**Communication and Public Relations**, *(Fall 2016):* This is an upper-level stand-alone online course taught to approximately 37 students for 1.5 hours twice a week. The course provides a foundation for the understanding and practice of public relations with theory and principles that guide its practice, and apply coursework to public relations projects and build a public relations portfolio.

**Communication and Public Relations (online)**, *(Summer 2016):* This is an upper-level stand-alone online course taught to approximately 37 students five days per week for five weeks. The course provides a foundation for the understanding and practice of public relations with theory and principles that guide its practice, and apply coursework to public relations projects and build a public relations portfolio.

**Applied Organizational Communication,** (*Spring 2016*): This is an upper division stand-alone lecture that occurs once per week for 2.5 hours with 35 students. Students analyze organizational communication processes, and develop interpersonal, presentational, and group communication skills that are useful in business, governmental, and professional organizations.

**Communication Theory**, (*Fall 2015*): This is an upper division stand-alone lecture that occurs once per week for 2.5 hours with 35 students. This course is one of three classes required for undergraduate admission to the Communication major. The course focuses on the origin and development of basic concepts in communication theory and research, survey, and analysis of theories and models in research.

**Communication and Public Relations (online)**, *(Summer 2015):* This is an upper-level stand-alone online course taught to approximately 30 students five days per week for five weeks. The course provides a foundation for the understanding and practice of public relations with theory and principles that guide its practice, and apply coursework to public relations projects and build a public relations portfolio.

**Introduction to Interpersonal Communication**, *(Spring 2015):* This is an introductory course stand-alone lecture that occurs three times a week taught to 37 students. Students gain knowledge of basic interpersonal communication principles and apply principles in everyday interpersonal settings. Students involved in the FOCUS program with interpersonal skills and learning disabilities audited the course.

**Introduction to Small Group Communication**, (*Spring 2014, Fall 2014*): This is an introductory stand-alone lecture that met three times a week with approximately 30 students. The course is designed to explore how communication functions in small groups. In this course communication concepts are applied to actual situations as students participate in small groups throughout the semester.

**Public Speaking:** This is a university required introductory course to public speaking. This consisted of a teaching a 2-3-course load of 30 undergraduate students each. The fall (2012) involved two public speaking sections, while the spring (2013) comprised three sections. Responsibilities included lesson plans, teaching three times per week, holding office hours, grading in-class assignments and exams, and evaluating five speeches per student.

**Public Speaking:** This is a university required introductory course to public speaking. Duties involved shadowing 2 instructors per semester, for 2 semesters. Responsibilities included grading, evaluating, and teaching eight lessons in total.
